### INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).

§ 2.31 Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC).(d) IACUC review of activities involving animals. (1) In order to approve proposed activities or proposed significant changes in ongoing activities, the IACUC shall conduct a review of those components of the activities related to the care and use of animals and determine that the proposed activities are in accordance with this subchapter unless acceptable justification for a departure is presented in writing; (viii) Personnel conducting procedures on the species being maintained or studied will be appropriately qualified and trained in those procedures:

The IACUC have approved the protocol 15328 without looking at the qualifications of two of the surgeons. All people involved with animal use need to be approved by the committee to ensure that the people are properly trained. This is to ensure that the animals will be properly cared for. These people need to be approved by the committee before any procedures take place.

### FACILITIES, GENERAL.

§3.125 Facilities, general, (c) Storage. Supplies of food and bedding shall be stored in facilities which adequately protect such supplies against deterioration, molding, or contamination by vermin. Refrigeration shall be provided for supplies of perishable food.

K Barn (Bedding Storage): There was one open bag of shavings on the floor of the building. In addition, there was a stack of closed shaving bales stored on the floor. These bales are to be properly stored for the well being of the animals using the shavings as bedding. Storing them on pallets like the rest of the bales would resolve this.
